

letter from the C.E.O

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

What an exciting year it has been for Taylor Regional Hospital. We watched our long months of planning come to fruition with the completion of the 3-story Medical Office Building. The building is now open and houses Taylor Regional Surgical Associates and the TRH Laboratory, Business Office and Physician Billing. In the next few months, our OB/GYN services will also move into the building on the 2nd floor. The 3rd floor is currently under construction and will house Orthopedic services.

Under the direction of Dr. Asser El-Atfy, who is Board Certified in Internal Medicine, Pulmonology and Sleep Medicine, we opened a Sleep Studies Lab that performs diagnostic sleep studies for individuals with chronic sleep problems. We are experiencing a heavy utilization of this service.

To meet the need for Orthopedic services close to home, we obtained the services of Drs. Mehta and Sewell two days a week in Campbellsville. We continued to search for a full-time Orthopedic Surgeon for Campbellsville and were fortunate to locate two physicians who have committed to opening practices in Campbellsville. Dr. Richard Sanders joined us in the Fall of 2006 and the other physician is expected to join us in the Spring of 2007.

Taylor Regional Hospital was proud to support the opening of the Campbellsville University School of Nursing by providing scholarships for nursing students. We look forward to having this excellent source of candidates for nursing positions at Taylor Regional.

As you can see, we continue to expand our campus as well as our services. We remodeled both the Pharmacy and the Accounting Department to allow for a more efficient and secure environment. In the coming year we expect to see the completion of the new Pediatrics Wing, a parking lot expansion that will add 84 parking spaces and a new Endoscopy Suite that will free up our Operating Rooms for more complicated surgeries.

While we are pleased and excited about our construction projects and expanded services, what truly makes Taylor Regional Hospital such a great place for quality care is the team members who come to work every day to serve the needs of our patients. From nurses and doctors to office workers and food service staff, our team members make a difference every day. Whether they are involved in a life-saving procedure or assisting someone in the hallway, our team members are a positive influence in the lives of everyone who enters the doors of our hospital. We could not be such a successful, well-regarded hospital without our caring, compassionate and dedicated team members.



We continue to enjoy the advantages of our partnership

with Jewish Hospital HealthCare Services which recently became Jewish Hospital and St. Mary's HealthCare. They continue to support our progress and provide us with cost-saving opportunities and expertise in areas such as legal, financial, human resources and corporate compliance. 





H.O.P.E. Gala The H.O.P.E.

Medical Services Building Open The Medical

Services Building located next to the hospital was completed in January 2006. The first floor houses the Laboratory and Business Office. The second floor houses two physician offices, Taylor Regional Surgical Associates and Taylor Regional Physicians for Women. The third floor will be the location of the Taylor Regional Orthepedic Associates.

Parking Lot

Expansion TRH completed a \$500,000 parking lot expansion in November 2006 which provides the addition of almost 100 new parking spaces as well as a revised flow of traffic in and out of the hospital and a new landmark sign.

Endoscopy Suites

Open An expansion in the surgery department made room for two additional endoscopy suites, bringing the total number of suites to three. This allows the operating rooms to be open for more serious cases and should better allow for more convenient scheduling for these procedures.

Pediatric Wing

Open The \$1.5 million renovated pediatric wing opened October 16, 2006. The new wing includes nine private rooms complete with private baths and the latest modern technology and convenience for the youngest patients at TRH.

"On the evening of December 8th, the news had issued a Winter Advisory for our area. Kasey Moss works with my mother in Patient Registration. Due to my mother's health, Kasey called her and asked her to stay home that night so she would not have to get out in the bad weather and due to the fact she has a much further distance to drive than anyone else in the department. Kasey told my mother that it was supposed to be very icy the next morning and didn't want her to take the chance of either getting hurt or becoming ill. I guess what makes this so heartfelt for me is because Kasey had also worked second shift that night and in order to do this for my mother, that meant Kasey would have to pull a double shift. Most usually (if you know my mother's history) if she gets out in very cold weather and gets wet, she will normally end up in the hospital within the next week. Kasey, knowing this, offered to stay two shifts just to keep her from becoming ill and to keep her safe as well. This meant the world to me, not just anyone would be kind enough to put their self out and work a double shift just for the good of another person. Sleep Clinic Expansion TRH and Dr. Asser El-Afty opened a sleep clinic in January 2006. The two-bed lab is open three nights per week with two tests per night and is located in the hospital near the Emergency Department.

Time & Money Taylor Regional Hospital Auxiliary members have made a monetary donation of over \$13,000 for the purchase of new equipment to be used in numerous areas of the hospital. Taylor Regional Hospital Passes Infant Hearing

Evaluation The Universal Newborn Hearing Screening Program of the Cabinet for Health & Family Services recently conducted an annual survey at Taylor Regional Hospital.

Founded in 1951, the Joint Commission is dedicated to continuously improving the safety and quality of the nation's health care through voluntary accreditation. The Joint Commission's on-site survey of Taylor Regional Hospital occurred in September 2006. Additionally individual st and procedu hospital data and consulta

New IBEX

PulseCheck System The IBEX tracking board allows nurses and physicians to keep up with all of the patients in the Emergency Department. The board tells the patient's name, age, medical history, room number, what they are being treated for, who is treating them, what medications they have been given and when they last took it, their length of stay and any other comments from the staff. The board archives the information should the patient ever return their information is quickly available. The board also color-codes each patient by the urgency of their care to allow for an increased awareness of that person's care. TRH scored 50 out of a possible 50 points. Additionally, TRH scored at 5.00 for each of the ten individual standards which include test protocols, policy and procedure, equipment, test area, data submission, hospital data monitoring, specific data monitoring, contact and consultation, parental consent and information and annual staff training. For the past 6 years, all newborns at TRH have been given a hearing screening prior to release.

The hospital began the screening program two years prior to the state requirement and has always scored in the top 95th percentile.


