

COMMUNITY

Health Fair

More than 1,000 individuals and 50 vendors attended the Health Fair in June at the Taylor County Intermediate School. Lab screening tests including complete blood count, comprehensive metabolic profile, thyroid stimulating hormone screening, and coronary risk profile with cholesterol levels were collected from 641 people. Additionally, 238 were screened for prostate cancer. DaVita Dialysis also provided free kidney screenings.

Pediatric Outreach

Taylor Regional Pediatrics participated in several outreach activities throughout the year including Preschool Palooza at the Taylor County Public Library and Literacy Night at Taylor County Primary School. As a result, over 1,100 children benefitted from height and weight screenings, while enjoying face painting and free books.



Golf Scramble

The 10th annual Charity Golf Scramble was held in September. Fourteen teams participated in the event and numerous Taylor Regional Hospital Team Members volunteered to make it a great success. The Scramble raised over \$30,000 with all proceeds going toward the Taylor Regional Hospital Van Service. This free transportation service assists patients receiving services at the hospital, physician offices, cancer center or rehab services who otherwise would not be able to provide their own transportation.

Baby Fair

Over 65 individuals attended the Taylor Regional Hospital Baby Fair in October. A total of 24 expectant and/or new mothers visited the 24 booths hosted by TRH staff and community vendors. Dr. Avis Carr from Taylor Regional Physicians for Women provided a question and answer session for new/expectant parents. Dr. Scott Martin and Katosha Russell, APRN, from Taylor Regional Pediatrics gave informative lectures on cold symptoms and breast feeding, respectively.

Good Samaritans

The Taylor County Good Samaritans continue in the mission to provide help and encouragement for Taylor County families who are dealing with the reality of cancer. The Taylor County Good Samaritans Foundation is a non-profit, tax-deductible organization designed to ease the financial stress for those diagnosed with cancer and facing the unknowns of this devastating illness. In 2018, 32 Taylor County residents who were undergoing cancer treatments received \$250 each.

Campbellsville University Athletics

In August, Taylor Regional Hospital providers and Team Members volunteered their time to assist in providing physicals for all incoming Campbellsville University athletes. A total of 315 physicals were given over the course of the two two-day sessions held on the school's campus.

Provider Expansion

In September, Taylor Regional Physicians for Women providers Dr. Avis Carr and Denise Simmons, APRN began providing office hours in Greensburg . Additionally, Denise began seeing patients in Lebanon.



Taylor Regional Specialty

Physicians and Diagnostic Center

The Taylor Regional Hospital Specialty Physicians and Diagnostic Center opened in July. TRH providers from neurology, orthopedics, pediatrics and podiatry now provide services at the new facility. In addition to specialty providers, the Center offers an on-site laboratory, cat scan (CT), diagnostic radiology services and pre-admission testing. The Taylor Regional Hospital Specialty Physicians and Diagnostic Center is located at 187 Will Walker Road in Columbia.

Laboratory Services

In October, the Board of Trustees approved the purchase of new laboratory equipment, with work scheduled to begin in January of 2019. After a thorough evaluation of various vendor options, and the most up-to-date technology available, the decision was made to continue our partnership with Sysmex America for Hematology testing and forge a new partnership with Roche Diagnostics for Chemistry, Immunoassay, and Urinalysis testing. Through this implementation, the work flow of the department will be improved, with an added focus on decreasing turnaround times, as well as increasing in-house testing abilities. The conversion is expected to be completed with a full go live date set for May of 2019.

Taylor Regional Rehabilitation Services

The new Taylor Regional Hospital Rehabilitation facility officially opened in January. This new 15,000 square-foot facility also serves as the home of Taylor Regional Orthopedics and its providers Drs. Matt Feltner, Ruben Gonzalez and Galen Weiss. Taylor Regional Rehabilitation Services provides a comprehensive approach to patient care including physical, occupational and speech therapies. Additionally, sports medicine, post-op surgical care and work-hardening therapies are also available.

This state-of-the-art facility also features an aquatic therapy pool that can hold up to six patients. Aquatic therapy allows patients to heal faster in a pain-free, safe environment. By taking advantage of the body’s buoyancy in water, the pool eliminates 20—90% of a person’s body weight. Hydrostatic pressure promotes the healing and strengthening of injured tissue by reducing joint stiffness, decreasing swelling and lowering blood pressure levels.

SERVICE

Auxiliary volunteers honored for more than 7,300 hours of service

Taylor Regional Hospital's 47 auxiliary volunteers gave 7,318 volunteer hours in 2018 working at the information/greeter desks, surgery department, emergency department, mammography department, cancer center, cafeteria, and gift shop. The auxiliary also collected canned food items to be donated to the local food pantry as part of their service to the community.

The Volunteer of the Year Award was presented to Muriel Green who worked 844 hours during 2018. Joanne Waller, Hugh Howell, and Judy Mullins were each recognized as having reached the 1,000-hour mark.

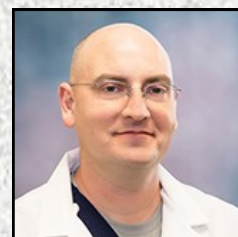
Dr. Michael Bahr joined Taylor Regional Surgical Associates. He received his medical education from the University of Tennessee College of Medicine.

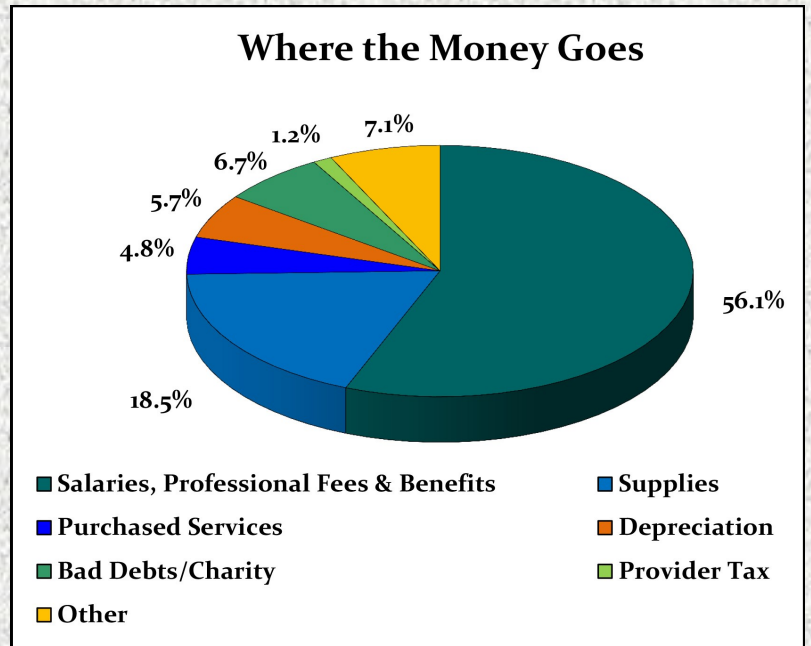
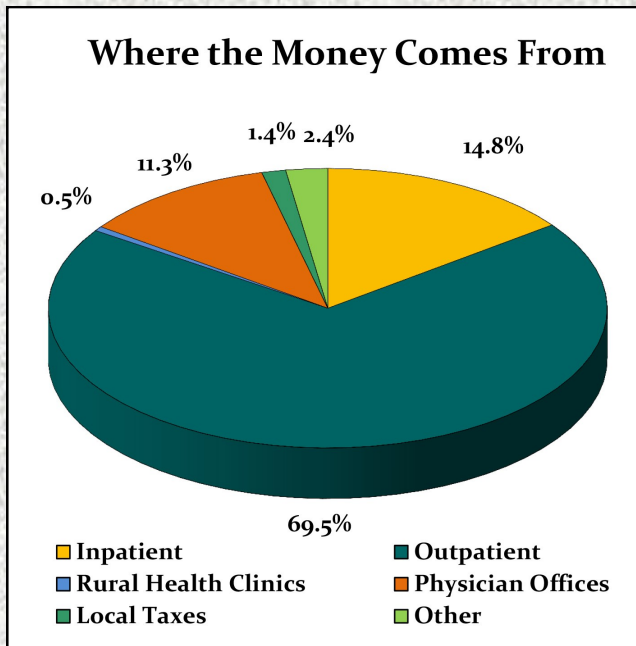
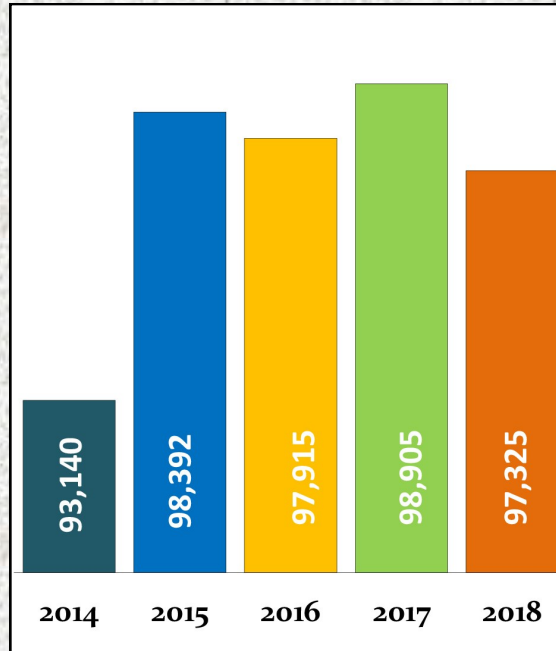
