In her residency program she served as Chief Resident and spent a lot of her program working on the da Vinci Robot. She brings a wonderful female perspective to the Urology practice and we are very fortunate to have her practicing at TRH; she is also a Campbellsville native. Dr. Griffin Tucker joined the Internal Medicine Associates practice, specializing in family practice. Dr. Tucker is originally from Campbellsville, and we are excited to welcome him back home. He also served as Chief Resident in his residency program.

We were fortunate last year to lease a da Vinci robot, allowing us to provide a new service to the appropriate patients. Not only is the robot being used in Urological cases it is also being used by Dr. James Watkins, a general surgeon with Taylor Regional Surgical Associates, on many cases.

This new technology can be linked to shorter recovery times and shorter hospital stays. It will be a great recruiting tool in the future as more and more physicians are trained on the robot in their residency programs.

May was a difficult month for us as we were hit with a cyberattack. I am thankful to say no personal information was accessed and our IT department did a great job of helping us weather the storm. Cyber security is something we take very seriously.

COMMUNITY

Community Health Fair

More than 1,000 individuals and 60 vendors attended the Health Fair in June at the Taylor County Intermediate School. Lab screening tests including complete blood count, comprehensive metabolic profile, thyroid stimulating hormone screening, and coronary risk profile with cholesterol levels were collected from 678 people. Additionally, 247 were screened for prostate cancer. DaVita Dialysis also provided free

Campbellsville University Athletics

In August, Taylor Regional Hospital providers and staff volunteered their time to assist in providing physicals for all incoming Campbellsville University athletes. A total of 350 physicals were given over the course

of the two two-day sessions held on the school's campus.



Cardinal Kids

In September, Cardinal Kids opened in the Taylor County School System. With offices in all three locations, Nurse Practitioner Morgan Altman and her team of registered nurses provide care for Taylor County students and faculty. Cardinal Kids provides care with no appointment needed and convenience to families during school and work hours.



Golf Scramble

The 11th annual Charity Golf Scramble was held in September. Fifteen teams participated in the event and numerous Taylor Regional Hospital Team Members volunteered to make it a great success. The Scramble raised \$30,000 with all proceeds going toward the purchase of a new van for the Taylor Regional Hospital Hospitality Van Service. This free transportation service assists patients receiving services at the hospital, physician offices, cancer center or rehab services who otherwise would not be able to provide their own transportation.

Taylor Regional Medical Explorers

Led by Drs. Ben Angel and Eugene Shively, the Taylor Regional Medical Explorers held their first meeting in September. Exploring is an interactive, worksite-based career education program of Learning for Life, an affiliate of the Boy Scouts of America. The club is geared toward high school aged participants who show an interest in and want to learn more about healthcare careers and opportunities. The Taylor Regional Medical Explorers meet monthly and participate in lectures, events and field trips.





Good Samaritans

The Taylor County Good Samaritans continue in the mission to provide help and encouragement for Taylor County families who are dealing with the reality of cancer. The Taylor County Good Samaritans Foundation is a non-profit, tax-deductible organization designed to ease the financial stress for those diagnosed with cancer and facing the unknowns of this devastating illness. In 2019, 51 Taylor County residents who were undergoing cancer treatments received \$250 each for a total of \$12,750.

GROWTH

Provider Office Renovations & Relocations

Taylor Regional ENT began seeing patients in their newly-renovated office in August. The \$278,000 project added two additional exam rooms and ENT chairs.

Taylor Regional Physicians for Women moved their practice to 105 Greenbriar Drive, Suite B in December. The \$210,000 project resulted in an additional four exam rooms and exam tables.



An open house was held in November to celebrate the addition of new state-of-theart chemistry analyzers in the laboratory. The Roche Diagnostic Cobas 8000 analyzers provide the highest level of quality available and increase the level of specimen throughput to better handle the large volume of procedures in and out of the lab. Additionally, the new analyzers allow new tests to be completed in house that in the past would have been sent to an outside reference laboratory for processing. As a result of the new equipment, we have been able to add additional thyroid levels T3, T4, rheumatoid factor (RF) and parathyroid hormone (PTH). This provides faster turnaround times for our patients.



da Vinci XI Surgical System

The first robotic-assisted surgery was performed at Taylor Regional Hospital on August 14th. The da Vinci XI Surgical System enables the surgeon to perform minimally invasive surgery with an advanced set of instruments and a 3D high-definition view of the surgical area. Minimally invasive surgery with da Vinci is widely used in urology, gynecology, and general surgery procedures throughout the country. Taylor Regional Hospital is the first hospital in our area to provide this technology.



Taylor Regional Hospital Joins Markey Cancer Affiliate Network



Taylor Regional Hospital joined the Markey Cancer Affiliate Network (MCCAN) in December. The MCANN is a group of community hospitals in the Commonwealth of Kentucky that provide high-quality cancer services and programs in their communities with the support of the center. The Markey Cancer Center was founded in 1983 and is a dedicated matrix cancer center established as an integral part of the University of Kentucky and the UK HealthCare enterprise. Markey functions as a multi-faceted, multidisciplinary complex with a mission to reduce cancer morbidity and mortality through a comprehensive program of cancer education, research, treatment and community engagement. In July 2013, Markey became one of only 71 medical centers in the country to earn an NCI cancer center designation. Because of the designation, Markey patients have access to new drugs, treatment options and clinical trials offered only at NCI-designated centers.



SERVICE

Auxiliary Volunteers Exceed 7,700 hours in 2019

Taylor Regional Hospital's 44 auxiliary volunteers gave 7,733 volunteer hours in 2019 working at the information/greeter desks, surgery department, emergency department, mammography department, cancer center, cafeteria and gift shop. The auxiliary also collected canned food items to be donated to the local food pantry as part of their service to the community.

The Volunteer of the Year Award was presented to Brenda Milby who worked 629 hours during 2019. Carolyn Gaines Howard was recognized as having reached the 1,000 hour mark.

Joanne Waller received the Service Volunteer of the Year Award.






Total Capital Expenditures in Fiscal Year 2019
